Description: This course focuses on the role transition of the professional nurse as provider of client-centered

Learners will participate in a clinical integrative practicum to experience the full spectrum of responsibilities and roles of the professional nurse. Role expectations of the professional nurse will be discussed and evidence-

based guidelines for professional nursing practice will be implemented.
