PN 145: Concepts of Practical Nursing I

Description: This course focuses on the chronic nature of certain states of being when nursing a client at

various stages in life, focusing on the application of the nursing process in meeting needs of clients in various settings, all within the scope of a practical nurse. The course will explore concepts related to emotional problems, pathological reactions to life stresses, and chronic pain. The course emphasizes therapeutic relationships and the development of individualized plans of care. The course will also address communication skills, mental health assessment, various therapeutic forms of balance, and sensory perception. Direct focused client care experiential learning gives learners

the opportunity to gain experience with many of these chronic conditions.
